Native Title Operations & Management Training (NTOMT) is an intensive 5-day workshop for PBC Directors, members and those working in the native title sector who are interested in better understanding & leveraging their PBC as a business. Hosted by the National Native Title Council (NNTC), RMIT, AIATSIS and Melbourne Business School, the workshop will be held at Cliftons conference centre, **Level 1/ 440 Collins Street, Melbourne 23-27 August 2021.**

The NNTC will cover the cost of the workshop- participants will need to fund their own travel and accommodation.

What does the course cover?

Leading experts from RMIT, AIATSIS, Melbourne Business School & the NNTC will deliver the training. The 5-day workshop will cover topics such as communications & marketing, business fundamentals, strategic conversations & stakeholder relationships, governance structures and finance. We'll also cover board roles and responsibilities, leadership, and negotiating & diplomacy within your PBC. Completion of the course can lead to formal TAFE accreditation and open pathways to higher education.
